Les Ollila

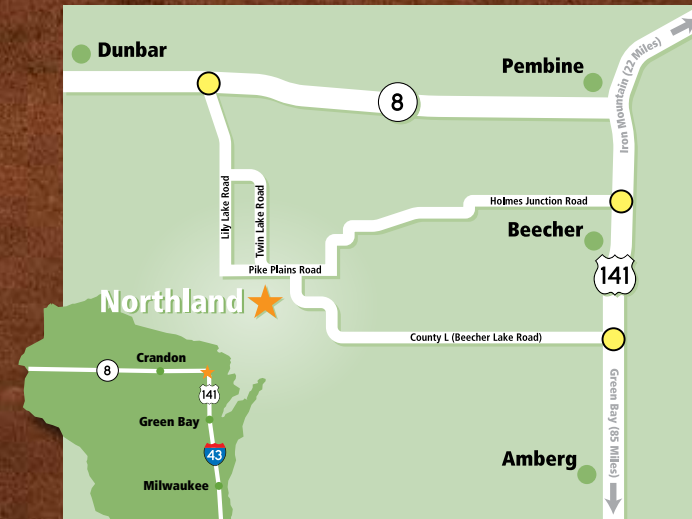

His model prayer centered on God’s will and its importance in all the events of life. Prayer is foundational to our daily walk, but how quickly we neglect it in our labors! We’re often too busy doing God’s work to seek His strength for the task. Join us in our 25th anniversary celebration of Heart Conference as we underscore this vital component of our faith and witness . . . prayer.

WORKSHOP TRACK DESCRIPTIONS

Preaching: the Voice of the Great Commission

“How shall they hear without a preacher?” (Rom 10:14). The Gospel message needs a voice to proclaim it, not just on the mission field, but particularly from the pulpit. Too quickly we treat the Good News dismissively as an add-on to the end of a sermon. But the messenger must bathe his words in the glory of the cross if he is to depict the Truth accurately. These workshops will help point you to the proper role of the Gospel in preaching.

Discipleship and Evangelism: Vehicles of the Great Commission

Since the command of Matthew 28:19 really means to “make disciples of all people,” the role of mentoring is essential to the Christian life. What are the common obstacles we face in discipling and how can we overcome them? What does a disciple-maker look like? Spend some time in these sessions to find out more about the method Christ used with His own pupils.

Leadership and Personal Life: Integrity in Great Commission Living

It has been said that God typically works in you before He works *through* you in ministry. There is much at stake in this age of failed leadership, so it is imperative that the man of God be consistent as he models the Great Commission in his own life. May the world see in every child of God a faithful “example of the believers” (1 Tim 4:12).

Church Ministries (men’s, women’s, teen’s, children’s, and family ministries)

These workshops are designed to help you deepen specific ministries within the church. If you’re trying to develop a heart for the Great Commission or if you’re simply looking for ideas to target particular groups in the Body of Christ, this is your track. May it strengthen your resolve to launch out into your community and “compel them to come” (Luke 14:23).

Current Issues in the Church

We cannot truly be “sober” and “vigilant” about our “adversary the devil” until we have an understanding of his attacks (1 Pet 5:8). Where he is unable to gain a stronghold, he is always content with a foothold, even within the very doors of the church. Hear some of the newest variations on the oldest strategy of dividing and conquering God’s people, and avoid being “ignorant of his devices” (2 Cor 2:11).
